### **3** Technical aspects of the competition (TD + CoJ)

3.1 Number of participants per category (Number of Member Associations: 26)

### **3.2 Practice**

- Both fields will be used for the competition some days.
- Free practice field will be open for people still involved in the competition every day from the beginning of the competition to 6 pm.

### Official Practice:

Qualification round practice:



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• 3 ends of 4 minutes practice on the Field of Play for qualification to immediately follow once the field is reset.

### **3.3 Equipment inspection:**

- During official practice of the related category.
- Located on the right side of competition field 1.
- Teams will be announced in (English) alphabetical order by the DOS.
- All teams are to wear their team uniform and have their valid accreditation.
- Spare equipment must also be brought for inspection.
- Classification card must be presented during the inspection.
- Team managers must check the details of their athletes such as, name, date of birth are correct beforehand.
- Inform the Judge if details are not correct and the Judge will inform Results Team.
- Instructions to use the tablet scoring system will be carried out if requested.

### 3.4 Athlete / Assistant / Spotter (back) Numbers:

- Athlete numbers will be issued on the day of the qualification round (with the score cards) during practice.
- Athlete numbers must be worn on the quiver or thigh, facing the waiting line while shooting.

• Assistants and spotters (for VI) must wear the same back number than the athlete they assist.

### **3.5 Qualification round**

• Refer to online schedule.

### 3.6 Individual elimination round

- Target faces will **NOT** be changed after practice arrows. Please instruct your athletes and assistants to mark all arrow holes during practice.
- Matches will start as soon as the field is ready.
- Matches at the start of each session will begin on time. Proceeding matches will follow up on the immediate completion of the prior match. Athletes should be alert and prepared for their matches to start slightly earlier than scheduled.
- In case of a bye, athletes may be allowed to shoot on their own target, provided the competition schedule allows. No score will be recorded or displayed and athletes shooting their bye must respect the DOS timing and signals of the competition. Recurve athletes are permitted to shoot 3 sets of practice and compound athletes are permitted to shoot 5 ends of practice for their bye.
- There will be no alternate shooting during the preliminary elimination rounds.

### 3.7 VI Category



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The schedule has been updated to be shorter and to avoid too many days with no shooting

for VI.

### 3.8 Doubles and mixed teams elimination round

- The double event is runed on the same way than the mixed teams event.
- Remind of rules :

• 13.2.2 In the Team Event (both teams shooting at the same time):

• The left/right position for matches shall follow the match play chart. The team on the top line of each pair (of the chart) shall shoot on the left-hand side of that match. The target allocation for each round of the competition is the choice of the organisers;

• Both teams shall start each end of their match with the athletes behind the 1m line. The first athlete may only cross the 1m line when the Director of Shooting has given the signal to start the match;

• The athletes in the team shall shoot two arrows each in an order of their own choosing; • One athlete shall occupy the shooting line, while the other athletes remain behind the 1 m line. No more than one athlete at a time shall be in front of the 1m line;

• Wheelchair athletes may stay on the shooting line throughout the match. They indicate that they have finished shooting by raising a hand above the head (see 21. Chapter 21-Para-Archery); • When moving forward to shoot, athletes shall not remove their arrows from their quivers until they are on the shooting line;

• In compound team matches, athletes shall not hook their release aids on the string until they are on the shooting line and the signal for shooting has been given. Once the athlete is on the shooting line and the signal for shooting has been given, the release aid may be hooked either before or after the arrow nocked on the string. This restriction shall not apply to Para Athletes whose classification permits a mouth tab which is permanently attached to the string;

• Violations of the Team Event rules shall be handled according to 15. Chapter 15-Consequences of Breaking Rules.

### 13.2.3 In the Team Event Finals Rounds (alternating shooting):

• Both teams shall start each end of their match with their athletes on the line; • The higher placed team in the Qualification Round shall decide the order of shooting of the first end. The team with the lower set points score for recurve and barebow, or lower cumulative score for compound shall shoot first the next end/set. If teams are tied, the team which started the match shall shoot first;

• Each team has to alternate between their members after each shot so that each member TM BOOKLET V0.4 1 August 2022 9:00



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has shot one arrow in each phase of the rotation;

• When the first team has shot two **and the athlete has returned behind the 1m line (raised hand) the clock of that team is stopped**, displaying the time remaining; • When the clock of the second team is started, the first athlete of that team may start shooting;

• This is repeated until both teams have shot four arrows or their time has expired;

• The team that shot first in the match shall start shooting the shoot-off and the alternation between the teams shall take place after every shot arrow.

### 3.9 Appeal procedure (Form attached)

- An Appeal form is attached to this document (see attached after this chapter, Appendix 1).
- In case of an intent to appeal or an actual appeal, the times indicated on the Appeal form must be considered.

• Appeal forms should be given to the Chairman of the Tournament Judge Commission or to their deputy.

• A fee of US\$50- (Euro 50.-) must be paid to the Chairman of the Tournament Judge Commission, for the appeal to be valid.

• If the appeal is upheld by the Jury of Appeal, the fee will be returned. In the case of the appeal being rejected, the fee will not be returned.

### 4 Technical matters (TD + CoJ)

### 4.1 Missing arrows

• All missing arrows on the practice or qualification field must be reported to the Judges and Field Crew immediately.

### 4.2 Timing control system

- Danage Timing system will be used for timing on the main field,
- Chronotir system will be used for timing on the practice field,
- WA timing and scoring system will be used for timing on the final field

### 4.3 Results system

• Qualification Round - scoring will be completed by athletes or assistants. One athlete/assistant records, on the official paper-based score sheet, the scores of all other athletes on that target. At the same time, another athlete, on that same target, will enter all the scores of the athletes on that target into the scoring tablet. The other athletes should verify that all scores are written and entered correctly.

• Scorecards MUST be signed by both the athlete and the scorer, have all the totals mathematically correct with the 10s+Xs and X count fully completed. Any scorecards where the 10s+Xs and X count are not completed a "0" will be given for the total of 10s+Xs and X count for that athlete. Any score cards not signed or the score total is missing will result in disqualification.



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• Elimination Round – scoring will be completed by athletes/assistants. One athlete/team records the arrow values of both athletes/teams on the paper score sheet. While at the same time, the other athlete/team inputs the arrow values into the scoring tablet. Both athletes/teams should verify that all scores are written and entered correctly before returning back to the shooting line.

• At the end of the match, the scorecard must be fully completed and signed by the athletes (or agent/judge in the case of finals) involved in the match.

• Scoring tablets will be used during the Qualification and Elimination Rounds, but not in the Finals. Mr. Ardingo Scarzella (World Archery Europe Results Team) is responsible for the results of the event.

# • IMPORTANT NOTE: There will be internet access in hotels. Because of this we will not distribute any printed results and information.

### **5** Rules that apply in this event

### 5.1 The rankings

• The Para World Rankings (<u>https://worldarchery.org/world-ranking</u>) are updated every two weeks.

### **5.2 Dress regulations**

• Athletes, officials and staff should wear the appropriate clothing having the correct appearance when on the field during competition. Open-toed shoes or camouflage clothing, accessories or archery equipment are not permitted.

• Athletes, team officials and technicians should wear their national team uniforms and sports shoes having the same appearance as per the division, following World Archery rules.

• During finals with TV coverage, undershirts, compression shirts or sleeves may be used on condition that they match the team uniform colours or are white. Under shirts and sleeve may include design, names or markings but the predominant colour should be white or the colour of the uniform.

• We would like to remind all teams that athlete names and country names or codes are mandatory on the back of their national team uniform shirts for athletes participating in World Archery major events.

### **5.3 Accreditation cards rules**

Rule Book 2 – 3.8 Accreditation

• 3.8.1.1. Proof of accreditation shall be carried at all times on the competition area and shall be shown on request of appropriate officials.

• 3.8.1.2. Only holders of appropriate accreditation shall be allowed onto the relevant parts of the competition area.

Accreditation card:

• Athletes and team officials, registered in WAREOS, will be issued an accreditation and



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lanyard. Please ensure all details are correctly entered in WAREOS. Due to a pandemic situation and Protective Measures there will be no entry to the venue allowed to any person without official accreditation starting with Sunday July 31.

• Accreditation will be done by IANSEO and LOC using WA database during Sunday July 31 and Monday August 1 morning. TMs will check at IANSEO designated tent accreditation cards for their team and will cooperate with IANSEO if there for example are data and/ or photo missing and/ or incorrect.

### 6 Logistical aspects (OC) 6.1 Transportation

Based on the WAREOS registration LOC will arrange for local transportation for the teams flying to Rome international Airports and paying to LOC for such a service. Then there are either teams with their own local transport (private cars, rented minivans, buses) or teams ordering local transport from LOC.

Participants that fly to Rome International Airports will be met by either LOC driver/ volunteer at the arrival gate according to the flight itinerary and will be driven to hotel/ venue (arrivals until August 1); Participants arriving on July 30, July 31 and August 1 will be met by LOC volunteers at Welcome Desk and either directly driven to hotel/ venue or will be asked to wait until next bus/ minivan is available for them. There will be refreshment at the Desk.

A bus schedule is available on lanseo.

### 6.2 Accommodation

All teams are in official hotels. A list of the hotels is published on Ianseo.

### 6.3 Meals during the event

Lunch will be served at the venue. Breakfast and dinner in the hotels. Complete schedule of meals timing in the Venue is published on the results website. Cafeteria and buffet is available at the venue.

### 6.3 Water

Each participant will receive his/ her personal plastic bottle as a souvenir Fresh bottles of water are at disposal in the field. First bottle will be given to the participants; following will require the restitution of the previous one.

### 6.4 Non-Smoking

This is a non-smoking event.

Smoking is forbidden inside public buildings and all competition and training areas. This also includes electronic cigarettes, refer to book 3, Art.12.8.



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### **6.5 The environment**

Team managers, please instruct your team members to use the litter bins located on the competition, practice ranges and common areas at all times. Sanitary risky waste (masks, nife&fork, napkins etc.) should be thrown into blue plastic bags.

### 7 Impact of COVID-19

7.1 Local sanitary measures and regulation

All participants (archer, staff, officials, volunteers, ...) must follow WA and local rules and regulation.

• Athletes and officials should also be available for random alcohol testing during the competition, following World Archery rules.

### Article 3.13.3.1:

An intention to appeal when it might affect the progression of an athlete from one stage of the competition to the next, shall be expressed in writing and lodged with the chairperson of the Tournament Judge Commission within five minutes of the end of the relevant round or match, whichever applies. During the Finals of match play rounds, the notice of intent to file



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an appeal shall be given within five minutes of the end of the match, or prior to the start of the next match, whichever is first.

### Article 3.13.8:

Jury decisions shall be minuted and reported to the appellant, the chairperson of the Tournament Judge Commission and the organisers before the beginning of the next stage of the competition or before the awarding of prizes.
