# Introduction

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## 1.1 About this document

This Team Manager Booklet provides all essential information required for the smooth participation of teams in the event. It outlines key operational, technical, and logistical details to support team managers in their role before and during the competition. It is intended as a practical reference, highlighting the most important procedures and event-specific information. For full regulations, please refer to the official rules and relevant governing documents.

## 1.2 Key principles

### ➤ World Archery principles and regulations

All athletes and team officials are reminded to respect the principles of fair play, non-violence, and proper conduct at all times. Compliance with World Archery betting, anti-corruption, and anti-doping regulations is mandatory. For further details, please refer to [Book 1](#).

### ➤ The Environment

Team managers, please instruct your team members to always use the litter bins located on the competition, practice ranges and common areas.

### ➤ Water

To aid the environment, water will be distributed using water stations located at the covered area behind the shooting line. No plastic glasses will be provided, and all participants will receive a glass bottle in the welcome bag, to be used to refill water whenever they want.

### ➤ Non-Smoking

This is a non-smoking event.

Smoking is forbidden inside public buildings and all competition and training areas. This also includes electronic cigarettes, refer to [Book 3](#), Art.10.8.

Please ensure your passport is valid for at least six months from the date you enter the country, or you may not be admitted.



### 1.4 About the host city

### 3.3 Practice

#### ➤ Official practice

The Official Practice session for all athletes will take place on Tuesday, July 7<sup>th</sup>. Two sessions will be scheduled, first one for compound archers only (9:15 to 11:15), while the second one is provided for recurve archers (11:45 to 13:45).

Due to the high number of entries, and considering the impossibility to accommodate additional targets, the session has been split into two groups to ensure that all athletes have sufficient practice time.

No target assignment will be applied to the official practice session, and targets will be set at 50m and 70m, accordingly.

#### ➤ Free practice

A 64 targets practice field will be available from Sunday, July 5<sup>th</sup> till Saturday, July 11<sup>th</sup> for all athletes. The target assignment will not be applied to the official practice session, and targets will be set at 70 and 50m in proportion of competing athletes at registration closing.

Practice field is located at [Cantarranas Rugby Fields](#), and expected opening times will be the following:

MORNING SESSION: 9:00 to 12:00    EVENING SESSION: 17:00 to 20:00

- Practice sessions on Sunday, Monday and Saturday, July 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup>, will be determined and published by the LOC.



- Tuesday to Friday, practice range will be available for the teams at their disposal (bus shuttle service will connect Vallehermoso and Cantarranas July 7<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup>)

### 3.4 Qualification round practice

- 3 ends of 3 minutes practice on the Field of Play for qualification to immediately follow once the field is reset.
- Non-competing athletes can use the practice field.
- Transportation is available for athletes between the qualification field, training field and official event hotels. Schedule will be displayed in the official event hotel lobbies.

### 3.5 Rounds

After qualification rounds, the points will be allocated on the total score for the 72-arrow qualification, before applying any tie breaking rule.

Target faces will **NOT** be changed after practice arrows. During a session, they will be changed only if the judges require it. Please instruct your athletes to mark all arrow holes during practice and competition.

The sessions will start on time, when there is no practice arrows scheduled on the competition venue, the matches will start as soon as the field is ready. Athletes should be alert and prepared for their matches to start earlier than scheduled.

In case of a bye, athletes may be allowed to shoot on their own target, provided the competition schedule allows. If the competition schedule allows, no score will be recorded or displayed and athletes shooting their bye must respect the DOS timing and signals of the competition. For individuals, shooting will be limited to three arrows per end, the first three sets for recurve and five ends for compound. In the case of teams, it will be limited to six arrows for teams and four arrows for mixed teams (2 arrows per athlete) per end, a maximum of three sets for recurve and four ends for compound.

### 3.6 Equipment inspection

The equipment inspection will be done on a volunteering basis during official practice, meaning that any athlete can proceed to the equipment inspection area to get their equipment inspected. Athletes and coaches must present both sets of their country's uniforms at the equipment inspection area during official practice.

The equipment inspection will not be limited to only the official practice, judges can, at any time during the competition, require inspecting an athlete's equipment.

Additional equipment inspection will be carried for the top 8 athletes in the qualification round, and the top 8 athletes in the individual elimination round.

World Archery will use electronic bow scales for equipment inspection.

## Key rules & reminders

### 4.1 Dress regulations

- All teams are to wear their team uniform with their name and have their valid accreditation during official practice.
- Each athlete or team shall register at least two different uniform tops during the official equipment inspection for use at all Finals Venue elimination matches. The registered tops must be of clearly distinguishable colours or designs to ensure adequate visual contrast for spectators, media, and broadcast production. Failure to register two uniforms shall result in an official warning.
- Spare equipment must also be brought for inspection.
- Team managers are to check the details of their athletes such as, name, date of birth is correct beforehand.
- Inform the Judge if details are not correct and the Judge will inform the World Archery Results Team. Instructions to use the tablet scoring system will be carried out if requested.

#### ➤ Athlete (back) Numbers

- Athlete numbers will be issued on the day of the qualification round (with the score cards) during practice.
- Athlete numbers must be worn on the quiver or thigh, facing the waiting line while shooting, throughout the event including finals.
- For additional information and detailed regulations, please refer to [Book 3](#) - Target Archery, Chapter 18.
- World Archery is testing a digital signature for all scorecards. Each athlete will be identified with a QR code printed on the back numbers that will be used during the digital signature step. A thorough explanation will be given in the Team Manager Meeting.

### 4.2 Rules update

- The current World Archery Constitution and Rules are to be applied for this event [Book 3 \(version 2026-03-13\)](#)

#### ➤ Time to shoot an arrow:

11.2.1 The total time allowed to shoot an end will be determined by the total number of arrows to shoot in the end.

11.2.1.1 For World Ranking Events and other national or international events in which the organisers announce beforehand, the following will apply:

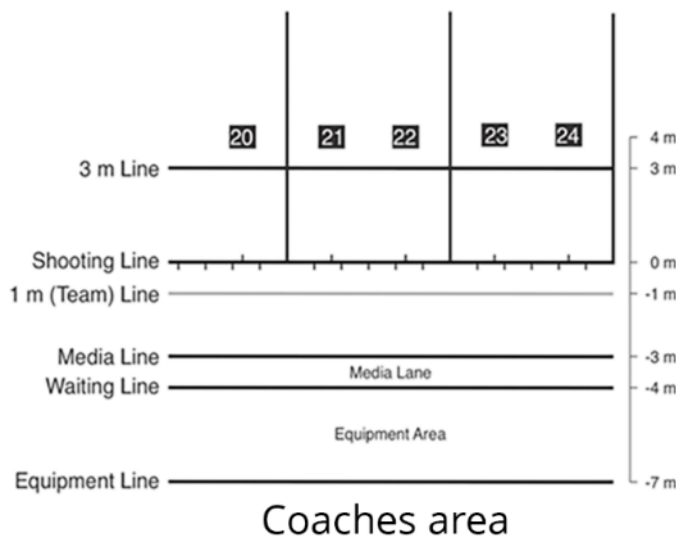
- 20 seconds per arrow is the time allowed for individual alternate shooting and all team and mixed team rounds, including shoot-offs.
- 30 seconds per arrow is the time allowed for individual shooting during qualifications and Match Play Rounds, where alternate shooting does not apply, including shoot-offs.



## ➤ Equipment Failure:

11.4.1. At world ranking events or other international events, including World, Continental, or Youth Championships, no extra time will be allowed for equipment failure or the treatment of medical problems, but the athlete concerned may leave the shooting line to resolve the issue and return to shoot any remaining arrow(s) if the time limit permits. In the Team Event, other members of the team may shoot in the meantime.

### 4.3 Waiting and shooting lines



A waiting line will be marked at least 4 metres behind the shooting line. A media line will be marked one metre in front of the waiting line. An Equipment line will be marked 3 metres behind the waiting line. Coaches will be able to stand in the Coaches area behind the equipment line

For Team rounds, the coaches will be allowed in front of the equipment line, to be along with the team. Coaches must step behind the 1 meter line at all times. Furthermore, only one scope per team (including the coach) will be allowed in the space between the shooting line and

the equipment line. If the team wishes to use a scope for the athletes, and one for the coach, then the coach must remain behind the equipment line.

### 4.4 Appeal procedure

- An Appeal form is [attached](#) to this document.
- In case of an intent to appeal or an actual appeal, the times indicated on the Appeal form must be considered.
- Appeal forms should be given to the Chairperson of the Tournament Judge Commission or to their Deputy.
- A fee of 50 USD (or 50 EUR) must be paid to the Chairperson of the Tournament Judge Commission, for the appeal to be valid.
- If the appeal is upheld by the Jury of Appeal, the fee will be returned. In the case of the appeal being rejected, the fee will not be returned.



## Timing & results systems

### 5.1 Timing control system

World Archery timing equipment will be used for timing and scoreboards on preliminary rounds and finals. During qualifications and elimination rounds, the clock will run until the end, without interruption of the Director of Shooting.

### 5.2 Results system

Scoring tablets will be used during the Qualification and Elimination Rounds, but not in the Finals. World Archery is currently testing a digital signature scorecard, to be signed using the athletes QR codes. These are either found in the athletes' accreditation card or printed on the back numbers. A thorough explanation will be given in the Team Manager Meeting.

#### ➤ Qualification Round

- Scoring will be completed by athletes. One athlete record, on the official paper-based score sheet, the scores of all other athletes on that target. At the same time, another athlete, on that same target, will enter all the scores of the athletes on that target into the scoring tablet.
- Scorecards MUST be signed by both the athlete and the scorer, have all the totals mathematically correct with the X and 10s count fully completed.

#### ➤ Elimination Round

- Scoring will be completed by athletes. One athlete/team records the arrow values of both athletes/teams on the paper score sheet. While at the same time, the other athlete/team inputs the arrow values into the scoring tablet. Both athletes/teams should verify that all scores are written and entered correctly before returning to the shooting line.
- At the end of the match, the scorecard must be fully completed and signed by the athletes (or agent/judge in the case of finals) involved in the match.
- Mr. Matteo PISANI is responsible for the results of the event.

**IMPORTANT NOTE: There will be internet access in the official hotels and the venues. Because of this we will not distribute any printed results and information.**

### 5.3 Rankings

## Logistics

### 6.1 Arrivals and departures

Upon arrival, you will be greeted by a Local Organising Committee volunteer holding a sign. You will then be escorted to LOC transportation for transfer to your hotel, where a room has been reserved for the duration of your stay.

## 6.4 Internet Access and additional hotel charges

Most of the accommodation buildings provide free access to the gym and to the swimming pool.

## 6.6 Clean sport

World Archery's Anti-Doping Rules, aligned with the World Anti-Doping Code, aim to protect athletes' health and ensure fair competition. Athletes and support personnel participating in the event may be subject to doping control procedures conducted by World Archery and/or the International Testing Agency (ITA).

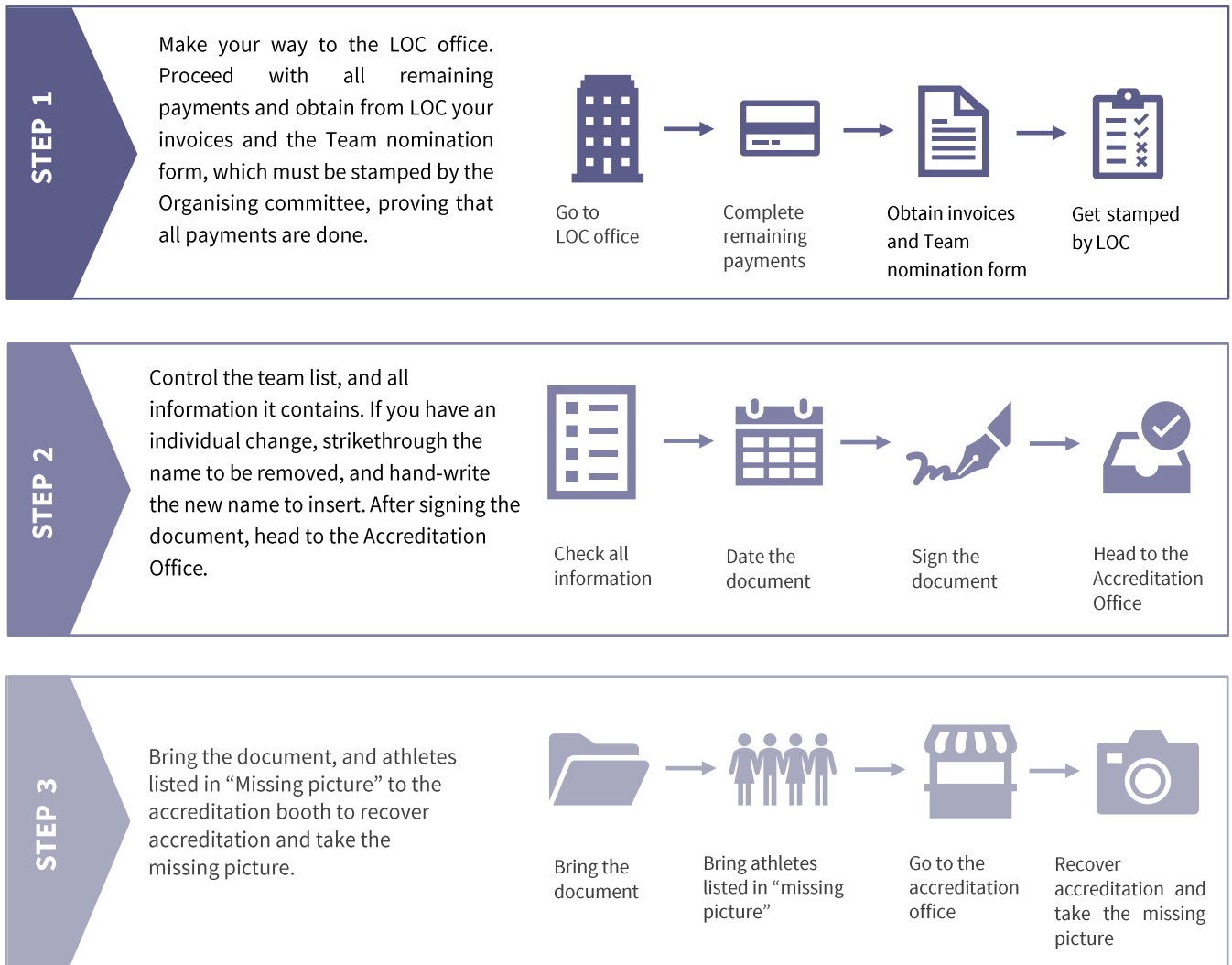

## Accreditation

### 7.1 Accreditation process

Before arriving at the event, make sure with your Member Association that all payments are done, and that you carry all necessary payment proofs if they are not already registered in your summary of costs on WAREOS.



**Note: Athlete in the “picture to retake” section, will need to come later during the week when all accreditation process is over, priority is given to missing pictures.**

Accreditation services will be available in Cantarranas Practice field on Monday, July 6<sup>th</sup> from 9:30 to 11:30 and from 17:30 to 19:30, and in Vallehermoso Stadium on Tuesday, July 7<sup>th</sup>, 9:00 to 13:00.

All participants must complete the registration and accreditation process upon arrival. Whenever possible, accreditation should be completed on Monday, depending on each participant's arrival day and time. Once accredited, participants will receive the necessary credentials granting them access to the Field of Play. Access to the competition area is restricted to accredited individuals only.



During this season we are also testing a digital queue system, the day of official practice a QR code will be sent in the WhatsApp group and posted throughout the venue for Team Managers to join. Once your turn comes, you will receive a text via WhatsApp, and you can make your way to accreditation.

## 7.2 Accreditation cards

Athletes and team officials registered in WAREOS will receive one World Archery accreditation and lanyard valid for the entire 2026 season. It must be brought to all World Archery events, including World Championships and Hyundai Archery World Cup events. It must be validated on site at each event.

The QR code on the accreditation will be scanned to access competition areas. Only competing athletes and one coach/official are allowed on the Field of Play.

### ➤ Photographs

Athletes without an existing photo will have their picture taken at the venue the day before official practice.

To ensure the photo is valid, please:

- ✓ Smile
- ✓ Wear your official Member Association team uniform

These photos will be used for:

- ✓ Event accreditation
- ✓ Athlete biographies on the website

### ➤ Replacement Accreditation

If an accreditation is forgotten, damaged, or lost, a replacement badge can be purchased at the World Archery accreditation desk during the event.

- Replacement cost: 50 CHF
- EUR, USD, and local currency will also be accepted
- Exchange rates will be displayed on site

### ➤ Upgrade card

Upgrade cards are available for teams without a coach or team manager. They allow another accredited person or athlete to act as coach for a specific athlete or team during the event.

Please note:

- Each upgrade card is valid only for the assigned person and athlete/team
- The card is no longer valid once the athlete/team is eliminated
- The card is only upgraded for the concerned event



Cost:

- CHF 20 per card
- EUR, USD, and local currency are also accepted at the displayed exchange rate
- The fee is charged during the qualification and elimination stages. If an athlete qualifies to the finals and do not have a coach, World Archery can authorise upon the Team Manager request the upgrade of a teammate card/access without extra cost.

Upgrade cards are not available:

- For teams already at the maximum number of officials allowed under World Archery rules
- For guests

Only one accredited team official per athlete is permitted, with a maximum of four officials per team allowed on the Field of Play.

## Protocol

### 8.1 Medal ceremonies

- All athletes involved in the ceremonies are requested to go to the gathering point by the athletes' entrance to the main Field of Play, equipment can be stored in the staging area until the end of the corresponding victory ceremony.
- Bronze medal winners are requested to be present at the final venue gathering point of the Award Ceremony, 20 minutes before the ceremonies are due to start.
- Medal winners must be in full uniform.
- Upon arrival to the venue, please reach out to the Technical Delegate or Event Manager so they know your location.
- Medal ceremonies will be conducted immediately after the interview of gold medal winner of each category during the days of the finals (please check the competition schedule).
