### 3. For Your Information

Juniors shooting as Seniors	Juniors over the age of 12 are welcome to shoot on an equal footing with senior Archers and compete for the senior medals but must enter and pay as seniors.
Junior Shooting Groups	Junior archers will be placed in the same target group as their senior family member if shooting. If a senior family member is not shooting, then, Junior members must be accompanied by a parent/family adult member/responsible designated adult and always remain the responsibility of their parent/guardian.
Special Requirements:	Archers with a disability, or other special requirement should contact the Tournament Organiser if there is any matter that they wish to raise.
Red Call	If emergency assistance is required in the field. <b>The following procedure will apply.</b> The archers call the <b>target number</b> followed by <b>RED</b> . When the call is heard by other archers, they will immediately stop shooting and repeat the call. Shooting will recommence on a whistle. No one will resume shooting until the restart is signalled.





It is recommended that competitors wear clothing appropriate to the venue and weather conditions. Dress should be in line with WA and AGB regulations.
In accordance with World Archery rules, searches for lost arrows must not delay shooting groups. When searching for lost arrows, please ensure that 1 archer always remains in front of the boss. If a shooting group arrives at the target, please move on, and <b>do not delay shooting.</b> Please <b>record all lost arrows on your scorecard</b> and then record them on the lost arrow sheet at the end of the shoot.
Please inform the Tournament Officer prior to the competition, if you have any allergies which may affect you or other archers during the competition
No smoking (including e-cigarettes and VAPE cigarettes) is permitted on the course.
Archers competing at this championship may be liable for drugs testing, competitors who are approached to give samples must comply. Non-compliance will be treated as a positive result. Parents / Guardians must sign the relevant box on the entry forms giving consent for junior archers (Under 18s) to be drug tested if approached.
By entering this tournament, you agree that information may be collected and shared with tournament Organiser, Archery GB and other competitors and published on IANSEO. Some information may also be published in documents or lists relating to the event at a schedule decided by the Organiser. These include the entrant's name, gender, bow style age category, email addresses and/or contact numbers provided, club, county, and any assigned codes for this information.
Archers are permitted take pictures as long as they are not published on social media until after the event. In line with <u>Archery GB Safeguarding Children and Young People Policy</u> , the organisers of this competition require anyone wishing to engage in photography and/or videoing to register their details before engaging in this activity. Please ensure if taking photographs you do not distract archers shooting. If parents/carers have any particular concern about their child/young person being photographed or filmed they should notify the Tournament Organiser. Please note, in line with the Photographing & Filming Children & Young People in Sport policy you may be required to obtain written permission from the subject and/or their parents/carers to publish images on the internet or in print. Entry confirms that attendees may be photographed/recorded on the day and these may be used for LCB publicity purposes, including web site and social media sites. If you do not wish to have your photograph taken/published please notify the Tournament Organiser/indicate on the photograph register.


#### Where exactly is Bally Walter Park?



Ballywalter Park is approximately 10.5 miles from Newtownards travelling via Greyabbey.

From Bangor (via Carrowdore) it is approximately 13.5 miles and 16.5 miles following the costal route.

Travelling from Downpatrick via Strangford using the ferry it is approximately 22 miles. If using this route check that the ferry is operating.



**Enter Ballywalter Park** through the main entrance on the Ballyatwood Road. Bear right and proceed towards the main House, observing the speed limits in the estate. Proceed across the front of the House and at the bottom of the incline, turn left towards the Albany. Continue to the end of the lane and the car park will be on your left.

On leaving the estate, please take the lower road in front of the House.

Once you have your equipment set up, register for the shoot and a Judge/Field Marshal will direct you to the practice area.




Practice area


