3.1 Individual Events

There should be a minimum of four (4) athletes from two (2) nations.

3.2 Mixed Team Events

There should be a minimum of four (4) nations.



3.3 Special Circumstances

In exceptional cases where an event is already on the final programme and does not fulfil the viability criteria during the competition day, the following alternative steps can be taken:

- The Technical Delegate (TD) deserves the right and authority to move the athletes into another reasonable class, or combine different classes together; or
- The “Minus-One” rule shall apply, e.g. if an event is completed by only three (3) athletes/teams, gold and silver medals will be awarded. If an event is finalised by two (2) athletes/teams, only competed by an athlete, gold medal will be awarded only if record is broken.

4. Entries

Participating countries of territories must be official members of APSF. The participating athletes must be citizens of the same country or territories of their delegation. They must also meet the requirements as prescribed in the general provision of the Games.

Athletes must be over 15 years old. (Calculation method: 2017 minus year of birth)

4.1 Policies

Each NPC may enter:

- **Individual events:** a maximum of three (3) athletes;
- **Mixed Team events:** a maximum of one (1) team comprising two (2) athletes; (one male and one female)
- Athletes for the mixed team event who must be selected from those who have competed in the individual event.



4.2 Entry Timelines

Expression of Interest (EOI):

The first (preliminary) entry form (Expression of Interest) was sent out to all ASEAN member nations on **15th August 2016**. Each delegation must fill up the reply form indicating their intention to participate in the Games. They must also indicate the expected sports and number of competitors and staff who will be participating in the Games. This entry must be returned to the Secretariat before **5th September 2016, Malaysia time (GMT +8)**.

Entry by Number (EBN):

The second entry form (Entry by Number) was sent out to all ASEAN member nations who have indicated their intention to participate in the Games in **1st January 2017**. Each delegation must notify the Secretariat on the number of competitors who will be participating in each event. This entry must be returned to the Secretariat before **31st March 2017, Malaysia time (GMT +8)**.

Final Entry by Name (FEN):

The final entry form (Final Entry by Name) will be sent out on **12th May 2017**. This entry must be returned to the Secretariat before **12th July 2017, Malaysia time (GMT +8)**.

The competition venue is available for use as the training venue before the Games period. Once the Games start, the competition venue can only be used for training if competition has ceased. The training schedule will be distributed later once the team arrives.

9. Competition Procedures, Rules and Regulations

9.1 Competition Format

Refer World Archery (WA) Book 3, Chapter 21 (PARA)

9.1.1 Individual Recurve Open

Individual Recurve Open events (male and female) shall consist of Qualification Round and Elimination Rounds. The competition formats are as follow:

- Qualification Round
 - a. Two (2) rounds of 36 arrows each
 - b. Six (6) ends of six (6) arrows per round
 - c. Four (4) minutes per end
- Elimination Round
 - a. 1/16 match-play chart
 - b. Maximum five (5) sets of three (3) arrows – two (2) points for a win, one (1) point for a draw and zero (0) points for a loss
 - c. Timing: 2 minutes per set for non-alternate shooting, 20 seconds per arrow for alternate shooting
 - d. The first athlete to reach six (6) points wins the contest and qualifies for the next round

All shots in Qualification and Elimination Rounds are taken from 70m with 122cm target face, with a maximum of ten (10) points per arrow. The athlete with the highest score/number of set points is the winner.



9.1.2 Individual Compound Open

Individual Compound Open events (male and female) shall consist of Qualification and Elimination Rounds. The competition formats are as follow:

- Qualification Round
 - a. Two (2) rounds of 36 arrows each
 - b. Six (6) ends of six (6) arrows per round
 - c. Four (4) minutes per end
- Elimination Round
 - a. 1/16 match-play chart
 - b. Cumulative scoring
 - c. Five (5) sets of three (3) arrows
 - d. Timing: 2 minutes per set for non-alternate shooting, 20 seconds per arrow for alternate shooting

All shots in Qualification and Elimination Rounds are taken from 50m with 80cm, 6-ring target face, with a maximum of ten (10) points per arrow. The athlete with the highest score is the winner.

9.1.3 Mixed Team

- Mixed Team Recurve
 - a. Top male and female athletes from each NPC;
 - b. Ranking based on total qualification scores;
 - c. Maximum four (4) sets of sixteen (16) arrows – two (2) points for a win, one (1) point for a draw and zero (0) points for a loss;
 - d. Each set consists of four (4) arrows at eighty (80) seconds per set and two (2) arrows per athlete for non-alternate and alternate shooting;
 - e. The first team to reach five (5) set points wins the contest and qualifies for the next round.



All shots are taken from 70m with 122cm target face, with a maximum of ten (10) points per arrow. The team with the highest number of set points is the winner.

- Mixed Team Compound

- a. Top male and female athletes from each NPC;
- b. Ranking based on total qualification scores;
- c. Cumulative scoring for sixteen (16) arrows – four (4) ends of four (4) arrows at 80 seconds per end and two (2) arrows per athlete;
- d. The team with the highest cumulative score wins the contest and qualifies for the next round.

All shots are taken from 50m with 80cm, 6-ring target face, with a maximum of ten (10) points per arrow. The team with the highest cumulative score is the winner.

9.2 Tie-Break Procedures

- Qualification Round

Tie-breaks for both Individual and Team events will be conducted in the following manner:

- a. Greatest number of 10's (including inner 10's)
- b. Greatest number of X's (inner 10's)

If athletes are still tied after applying the above, a coin toss will decide the ranking.

- Elimination Round

Individual events, a single arrow will be shot for score. If there is still a tie, the arrow shot closest to the centre of the target face will resolve the tie; or successive single arrow nearest-to-the centre shoot-offs, until the tie is resolved. In alternate shooting, the athlete that shot first in the match will start the shoot-off.



Mixed Team events, in the event of a tie, the following tie-breaking procedures will take place:

- a. A (two (2)-arrow for Mixed Team), a single arrow by each team member;
- b. If score is tied, the team with the arrow closest-to-the-centre will win;
- c. If still tied, the second (or third) arrow closest-to-the-centre will determine the winner.

In alternate shooting, the team that shot first in the match will start the shoot-off.

9.3 Competition Rules

The Archery competition will be held in accordance with the latest edition of the World Archery (WA) rules that are in force during the conduct of the Games. In the case of any disagreement in the rules and regulation, it shall be resolved by Jury of Appeal.

10. Clothing and Equipment

Clothing and equipment used by athletes must comply accordingly.

10.1 Equipment used or clothing worn by athletes and other participants at the 9th ASEAN Para Games Archery Competition must comply with the WAF Constitution and Technical Rules and with the APSF Statutes and Rules.

All athletes shall wear clothing specified in WAF Rules (Dress Regulation, Article 20, Book 3) in competitions and official ceremonies.

Equipment Inspection

- 18 September 2017 during official practice
- Located in the athlete shelter
- Teams will be announced in English alphabetical order by DOS
- All teams are to wear their uniform
- Spare equipment must also be brought for inspection



- Team Captains are to check the details of their athletes such as name, ID numbers are correct
- Inform the Judge if details are not correct and the Judge will inform Results Team.
- Instruction to use the scoring PDA terminals will be carried out if requested.
- Athletes numbers will be issued on the day of qualification round during practice
- Athletes numbers must be worn on the quiver or thigh, facing the waiting line while shooting

10.2 Competition Attire

- 10.2.1 Athletes, officials and staff should wear the appropriate clothing and have the correct appearance when on the field during competition
- 10.2.2 Athletes, team officials and technicians should wear their national team uniforms and sports shoes having the same appearance as per division, following WA rules.
- 10.2.3 We would like to remind all teams that athletes names and country names or code are mandatory on the back of their national teams uniform shirts.

11. Jury of Appeal

The Jury of Appeal shall consist of the Technical Delegate as the Chairman, as well as two (2) members who will be appointed from the participating teams during the Team Manager's meeting.

12. Appeals and Protest

A Judge Commission will be appointed to oversee the technical aspects of the competition. It will be responsible for considering any technical complaints or dispute and acting when necessary. A Judge's decision is final with respect to the value of an arrow in a target. All disputes must be resolved before any arrow has been removed.



With the exception of the value of a judged arrow and the decision of a Judge to raise a yellow card, an athlete can appeal against any unfair issues that were not according to the WA Rules and that the decision or action was an interpretation or decision of the Judge.

An intention to appeal, when it might affect the progress of an athlete from one (1) stage of the competition to the next, shall be expressed in writing and lodged with the Chairperson of the Tournament Judge Commission within 15 minutes of the end of the relevant round or match, whichever applies.

13. Doping Control

The doping control programme implemented during the Games will be carried out in accordance with the ASEAN Para Sports Federation Anti-Doping Code, and will comply with the 2015 World Anti-Doping Code and its relevant international standards.

14. Victory Ceremony

Victory ceremonies will be held shortly after each final. The competitors taking part in a victory ceremony shall wear their official NPC attire.

14.1 Medal

The following medals will be awarded:

First Place	: Gold
Second Place	: Silver
Third Place	: Bronze



15. Sport Information Centre (SIC)

The Sport Information Centre (SIC) in the Shangri-La Hotel Kuala Lumpur will provide sport information to NPCs throughout the Games. The SIC is opened to proxy card holders which is limited to Chefs de Mission, Deputy Chefs de Mission and team officials (Ac, Am, Ao and As). NPCs should note that it is not open to athletes. The SIC will contain sport-specific for every sport and discipline and the variety of services provided to NPCs are as follows:

- The dissemination of general sport information, thought sport publications and discussions with sport-specific staff.
- The distribution of results, draw/start lists and other key competition.

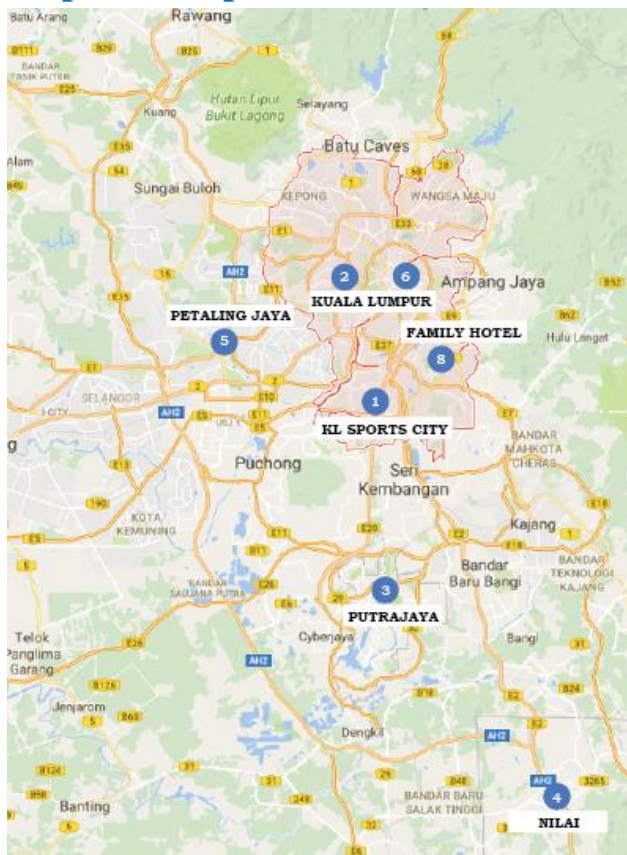
