

RULEBOOK LOWLANDS SHOOTOUT 2018

Jury of Appeal

The formation of the Jury of Appeal will be announced during the athletes briefing. Protests against decisions of the judges need to be reported either within 5 minutes (verbally) or within 15 minutes (written; templates available) to the head judge. For the submission of a protest, you will be charged €10,00. In the case of the protest being accepted you will get this fee back. In the case of it being declined, you will not get the fee back.

For the Jury of Appeal, World Archery, Book 2, Article 3.13 will apply.

Athletes briefing

10 minutes prior to the start of every competition there will be an athletes briefing. The athletes will be informed about the competition and any particularities.

Practice

At all venues the competition will begin at 8:30 AM, starting with 3 practice ends of 4 minutes each.

Qualification

Qualification of every Lowlands Shootout consists of 2 times 36 arrows at 70m for the recurve division (Olympic Round) and 2 times 36 arrows at 50m for the compound division (Compound Round)

In the event of a tie there will be immediate shoot offs for the ranking positions that determine whether an archer will or will not compete in the finals. With Recurve Men and Compound men this will be for 32nd position and with Recurve Women and Compound Women this will be for 16th position.

In the case of a tie for any other position the decision will be based the amount of 10's and X's combined (1) and X's alone (2). In the event of this being a tie as well there will be a coin toss, performed by the judge.

The archers themselves are responsible for noting the amount of 10's and X's on the scoreforms.

Finals

Compound Women

In this category the top-16 athletes, after qualification, will proceed to the finals. These duels will be shot according to a cumulative score of 15 arrows, shot in 5 ends of 3 arrows each, on a distance of 50 meters.

Recurve Women

In this category the top-16 athletes, after qualification, will proceed to the finals. These duels will be shot according to a set-system where a best-of-five system will be applied. The duels will be shot on a distance of 70 meters.

Compound Men

In this category the top-32 athletes, after qualification, will proceed to the finals. These duels will be shot according to a cumulative score of 15 arrows, shot in 5 ends of 3 arrows each, on a distance of 50 meters.

Recurve Men

In this category the top-32 athletes, after qualification, will proceed to the finals. These duels will be shot according to a set-system where a best-of-five system will be applied. The duels will be shot on a distance of 70 meters.

For further explanation, see the World Archery Rulebook.

The amount of athletes per category, with four out of five competitions, in 2018 will determine the amount of athletes that will proceed to the finals in 2019. If with four out of five Lowlands Shootouts in 2018 at least 32 athletes (W+M) have attended, there will be 32 athletes (W+M) in the finals in 2019. If with four out of five Lowlands Shootouts in 2018 less than 16/32 athletes have attended, there will be 8/16 athletes in the finals in 2019.

Competition progress

All athletes who reach the finals will shoot continuous finals. There will be duels for every ranking position. Athletes who have been defeated will proceed to a secondary round (loser round). See appendix 1 for the flowchart during the duels.

Final results Lowlands Shootout and ranking points

With each competition day there are ranking points to be earned by the athletes who reach the finals. These ranking points will be awarded according to the table below.

Final ranking Lowlands Shootout and placement for the final

All participating athletes will be ranked per category, according to their best three results during the Lowlands Shootouts. In each category the 8 highest ranked athletes will be qualified for the final, which will take place on the 19th of August (venue to be announced).

In the case of a tie in ranking points after all five Lowlands Shootouts, the following rules will apply in order:

1. Athletes will be ranked based on their highest individual ranking, acquired during one of five Lowlands Shootouts.
2. Athletes will be ranked based on their highest individual qualification score, acquired during one of five Lowlands Shootouts, independent from the acquired end ranking after the finals.

In the case of a tie after application of both rules stated above, the definitive ranking will be determined by a Coin Toss, performed by a judge after the end of the last Lowlands Shootout.

Lowlands Shootout Final

In the week after the last Lowlands Shootout (July 29th 2018) the 8 highest ranked athletes per category will be invited for the Lowlands Shootout Final. If any athlete, for whatever reason, is not able to attend the final, they are kindly requested to cancel before August 5th 2018. A cancellation will be irrevocable. For the places that will become available due to this event, stand by athletes will be invited.

Competition progress Final

In all four categories a head-to-head system will determine the winner of the Lowlands Shootout.

In the Recurve division this will be done through the World Archery set-system at 70 meters: best-of-five.

In the Compound division this will be done through the World Archery Compound Elimination Round at 50 meters: cumulative scores after 15 arrows.

Ranking start finals

The ranking which results from the three Lowlands Shootouts will be used as ranking for the final. The usual flowchart used for 8 athletes will be used (appendix 2)

Prize Money

In 2018, Lowlands Shootout has the largest prize pool of the Netherlands. There will be at least €10,000 being awarded as prize money. 30% of this will be awarded at the Lowlands Shootout Final. 70% will be awarded based on Lowlands Shootout ranking points, to be acquired during the five Lowlands Shootouts. Every archer that acquires ranking points, during any of the Lowlands Shootouts, will be awarded prize money at the end of the season.

Cancellation

Cancelling will be possible up until 14 days prior to the concerned competition by email through info@lowlandsshootout.nl. In this email, the IBAN-number should be stated on which the registration fee (-/- administration costs) can be transferred back to.
