3.3 Practice

- The Competition venue will be open for unofficial practice on 4th November during (09:00-11:00) + (16:00-18:00).
- There is no separate Practice field, all practice will be done on the Competition venue and there will be practice ends before every match.

Official Practice:

- Refer to online schedule <u>Qualification round practice</u>.
- 3 ends of 3 minutes practice on the Field of Play for qualification to immediately follow once the field is reset.

3.4 Equipment inspection:

- During official practice of the related category.
- Located on the right side of the field.
- Teams will be announced in (English) alphabetical order by the DOS.
- All teams are to wear their team uniform and have their valid accreditation.
- All para-athletes must bring their classification card to the equipment inspection
- Spare equipment must also be brought for inspection.
- Team managers must check the details of their athletes such as names are correct beforehand.
- Inform the Judge if details are not correct and the Judge will inform Results Team.
- Instructions to use the tablet scoring system will be carried out during official practice.

3.5 Athlete / Assistant / Spotter (back) Numbers:

- Athlete numbers will be issued on the day of the qualification round (with the score cards) during practice.
- Athlete numbers must be worn on the quiver or thigh, facing the waiting line while shooting.

3.6 Qualification round

3.7 Individual elimination round

- Target faces will **NOT** be changed after practice arrows. Please instruct your athletes and assistants to mark all arrow holes during practice.
- Matches will start as soon as the field is ready.
- Matches at the start of each session will begin on time. Proceeding matches will follow up
 on the immediate completion of the prior match. Athletes should be alert and prepared
 for their matches to start slightly earlier than scheduled.
- In case of a bye, athletes will not be allowed to shoot, they will get 3 practice ends before





















their next match.

There will be no alternate shooting during the preliminary elimination rounds.

3.8 Individual and Team Medal Matches

- Individual and Team Medal Matches will be held on the Finals Venue (Tuks Rugby Stadium)
- Refer to online and attached schedule for the finals matches including Live streaming.

3.9 Teams and mixed teams elimination round

- The Team event and Mixed Team events will run on the same way.
- Reminder of rules :

13.2.2 In the Team Event (both teams shooting at the same time):

- The left/right position for matches shall follow the match play chart. The team on the top line of each pair (of the chart) shall shoot on the left-hand side of that match. The target allocation for each round of the competition is the choice of the organizers;
- Both teams shall start each end of their match with the athletes behind the 1m line. The
 first athlete may only cross the 1m line when the Director of Shooting has given the signal
 to start the match;
- The athletes in the team shall shoot two arrows each in an order of their own choosing; one athlete shall occupy the shooting line, while the other athletes remain behind the 1 m line. No more than one athlete at a time shall be in front of the 1m line;
- In compound team matches, athletes shall not hook their release aids on the string until they are on the shooting line and the signal for shooting has been given. Once the athlete is on the shooting line and the signal for shooting has been given, the release aid may be hooked either before or after the arrow nocked on the string.
- Violations of the Team Event rules shall be handled according to 15. Chapter 15-Consequences of Breaking Rules.

13.2.3 In the Team Event Finals Rounds (alternating shooting):

- Both teams shall start each end of their match with their athletes behind 1m line;
- The higher placed team in the Qualification Round shall decide the order of shooting of the first end. The team with the lower set points for recurve or lower cumulative score for compound shall shoot first the next set/end. If teams are tied, the team which started the match shall shoot first;
- Each team has to alternate between their members after each shot so that each member has shot one arrow in each phase of the rotation;
- When the first team has shot three arrows and the athlete has returned behind the 1m
 line the clock of that team is stopped, displaying the time remaining; When the clock of
 the second team is started, the first athlete of that team may start shooting;
- This is repeated until both teams have shot six arrows or their time has expired;
- The team that shot first in the match shall start shooting the shoot-off and the alternation between the teams shall take place after every shot arrow.





















3.10 Appeal procedure (Form attached)

- An Appeal form is attached to this document (see attached after this chapter, Appendix 1).
- In case of intent to appeal or an actual appeal, the times indicated on the Appeal form must be considered.
- Appeal forms should be given to the Chairman of the Tournament Judge Commission or to their deputy.
- A fee of **US\$ 50 / Euro 50** must be paid to the Chairman of the Tournament Judges Commission, for the appeal to be valid.
- If the appeal is upheld by the Jury of Appeal, the fee will be returned. In the case of the appeal being rejected, the fee will not be returned.

4 Technical matters (TD + Chairwoman of Judges)

4.1 Missing arrows

• All missing arrows on the practice or qualification field must be reported to the Judges and Field Crew immediately.

4.2 Timing control system

Chronotir Timers and ianseo scoring system will be used for timing on the final field.

4.3 Results system

- Qualification Round There will be (2) athletes per target butt. The scoring will be completed by athletes. One athlete records on the official paper-based score card and the other athlete on that same target, will enter all the scores of both athletes on that target into the scoring tablet. In case of having a single athlete on one target, he will score with the neighboring target.
- Scorecards MUST be signed by both the athlete and the scorer, have all the totals
 mathematically correct with the 10s+Xs and X count fully completed. Any scorecards
 where the 10s+Xs and X count are not completed a "0" will be given for the total of 10s+Xs
 and X count for that athlete. Any score cards not signed or the score total is missing will
 result in disqualification.
- Elimination Round scoring will be completed by athletes. One athlete/team records the
 arrow values of both athletes/teams on the paper score card. While at the same time, the
 other athlete/team inputs the arrow values into the scoring tablet. Both athletes/teams
 should verify that all scores are written and entered correctly before returning back to the
 shooting line.
- At the end of the match, the scorecard must be fully completed and signed by the athletes (or agent/judge in the case of finals) involved in the match.
- Scoring tablets will be used during the Qualification and Elimination Rounds, but not in the Finals. Our result team is responsible for the results of the event.
- IMPORTANT NOTE: There will be internet access in hotels / Competition venue. Because of this we will not distribute any printed results or information.





















4.4 Update and reminder on the rules Dress regulations

- Athletes, officials and staff should wear the appropriate clothing having the correct appearance when on the field during competition. Open-toed shoes or camouflage clothing, accessories or archery equipment are not permitted.
- Athletes, team officials and technicians should wear their national team uniforms and sports shoes having the same appearance as per the division, following World Archery rules.
- During finals with TV coverage (Live) on the finals day 9th November, undershirts, compression shirts or sleeves may be used on condition that they match the team uniform colours or are white. Under shirts and sleeves may include design, names or markings but the predominant colour should be white or the colour of the uniform.
- We would like to remind all teams that athlete names and country names or codes are mandatory on the back of their national team uniform shirts for athletes participating in World Archery major events.

Time to shoot an arrow:

13.4.1. The total time allowed to shoot an end shall be determined by the total number of arrows to shoot in an end, where:

3.4.1.1. For World Ranking Events:

- <u>20 seconds per arrow is the time allowed for individual alternate shooting</u>, and for all team and mixed team rounds including shoot-offs;
- 30 seconds per arrow is the time allowed for individual shooting during qualifications,
 Olympic round and Compound rounds where alternate shooting does not apply, including shoot-offs.
- For all **para-archery** individual rounds at Para Archery World Ranking Events, the time per arrow shall be extended by 10 seconds for all situation aforementioned (40 seconds during qualifications).

Equipment Failure:

12.2.3. No extra time shall be allowed for equipment failure or the treatment of medical problems, but the athlete concerned may leave the shooting line to resolve the issue and return to shoot any remaining arrow(s) if the time limit permits. In the Team Event other member(s) of the team may shoot in the meantime.

Accreditation cards rules

Rule Book 2 – 3.8 Accreditation

- 3.8.1.1. Proof of accreditation shall be carried at all times on the competition area and shall be shown on request of appropriate officials.
- 3.8.1.2. Only holders of appropriate accreditation shall be allowed onto the relevant parts of the competition area.





















5 Logistical aspects (OC)

5.1 Accommodation and Transportation

All teams are in the official hotels (according to LOC) and will be provided transportation according to the schedule of the 12th African Archery Championships.

5.2 Meals during the event

Lunch will be served at the venue. Breakfast and dinner will be in the hotels.

5.3 Water

Drinking water in South Africa is safe to drink and cook with when taken from taps in urban areas like Pretoria. Containers of water will be used at the venue. Branded flasks will be delivered to the team managers during the team managers meeting for distribution to their respective teams.

5.4 Non-Smoking

This is a non-smoking event.

Smoking is forbidden inside public buildings and all competition and training areas. This also includes electronic cigarettes, refer to book 3, Art.12.8.

5.5 The environment

Team managers, please instruct your team members to use the litter bins located on the competition field and common areas at all times. Sanitary risky waste (masks, knife & fork, napkins etc.) should be thrown into plastic bags / trash pins.

6 Protocol and Ceremonies

- Kindly follow the online and attached schedule for the times of award and ceremonies of the Championships.
- For Para athletes, they will be awarded based on their Qualification results.

7 Medical related issues

- Ambulance will be present on the venue during competition.
- Medical person of the competition: There will be doctor and health support on the venue (LOC).

8 Clean Sport

8.1 Anti-Doping control

- Anti-Doping control will follow the rules of World Archery.
- Athletes should bring their passports and/or accreditation cards to the anti-doping control station if selected for a test.

8.2 Alcohol test

• Athletes and officials should also be available for random alcohol testing during the competition, following World Archery rules.
