The LOC, the TD and the CoJ will communicate to the teams using a WHATSAPP GROUP. If the Team Manager is not already member of the group he/she may ask to the TD.



Any official competition schedule will have the version number, date and time printed on it.

Practice

- The free practice field will be open :
 - o On Saturday from 08:00 to 17:00
 - On Sunday from 08:00 to 13:30

The practice field will occasionally be reserved for specific categories. The detailed schedule will be published in the official timetable.

Familiarization:

• Competing athletes will have 1 time a day to shoot on the official field of play.

Equipment inspection:

- During official practice on Friday afternoon.
- Located close to the official Field of Play.
- Spare equipment must also be brought for inspection.
- Team managers must check the details of their athletes such as, name, date of birth are correct beforehand.
- Inform the Judge if details are not correct and the Judge will inform Results Team.

Teams relay and mixed teams relay

The events will follow the European Cup rules. Each country can register one team by event. The number of **additional teams** allowed for each country by event will not be limited.

4 Technical matters (TD + CoJ)

Keeping time in the global schedule

The usual ranking time in 4K for male athletes must be under 35 minutes, and 45 minutes for female athletes. For organizational reasons, the Technical Delegate may declare that athletes exceeding these times as DNF (Did Not Finish) if necessary to maintain the competition schedule.

Missing arrows

• All missing arrows on the practice or official field must be reported to the Judges and Field Crew immediately.

Timing control system

• Electronic system will be used for timing on the main field.

Streaming and live streaming

World Archery Europe and World Archery make some experience of streaming/live streaming on this competition. The schedule may be updated regarding on this point.

5 Rules that apply in this event

5.1 Updated Rules for Run Archery – 2025 Season

We would like to highlight the recent updates to the Run Archery rules, which were released in January 2025, for the upcoming season. Please ensure that your athletes are familiar with these changes to save their rights and to avoid penalties or disqualifications.

A. Protest Process

Athletes or coaches who disagree with race results must lodge a protest within 15 minutes after the results are published. The protest should be made to the Chair of Judges, and a final decision will be announced before the next phase of the competition begins. The deadline for the protest will be written on the same page which shows the results. And this page will be published on the board.

B. Time Adjustments

In cases of target malfunctions which are not the athletes' fault, a time adjustment will be made by the judges by watching the video of the shooting line. In this case the athlete must inform the nearest judge.

For protests regarding missed shots, if a shot is judged as a valid hit after a protest, 10 seconds will be deducted from the athlete's total time for the additional arrow which was shot.

C. Marking the arrow holes

It is the responsibility of the athlete or spotter who pulls out the arrows to mark the arrow holes. The shooting range official or archery range judge will confirm that all holes are properly marked before the next race begins.

D. Shooting Validation

Spotters must clearly announce each shot's result to the athlete, using clear language (e.g., "2C

IN"). Athletes may protest the number of penalty loops announced by the spotter by raising an arm and shouting "Protest" before leaving the shooting range.

Reminder: To prevent confusion, athletes must keep their hand below shoulder height when releasing an arrow to avoid mistaken protests.

There are three boxes on the shooting report to be ticked and signed either by the judge or the athlete. They are:

- A (Accepted): When the judge states for a "hit" instead of a "miss" and the adjustment of time. The judge thinks and accepts that the athlete is right. (Judge will sign)
- **R** (Rejected): When the judge confirms the spotter statement. The judge rejects the athlete's protest. (Judge will sign)
- **W** (Withdrawn): When the athlete withdraws the protest. (Athlete will sign)

E. Penalties and Sanctions

If an athlete protests a clear shot in an attempt to gain an unfair advantage, a 1-minute time penalty will be applied for violating the principles of fair play and sportsmanship. Repeated behaviour of this nature will result in the athlete's disqualification.

Coaches and spectators violating course prohibitions (e.g., running alongside athletes, touching athletes, using whistles, or shouting "protest" during shooting) may face removal from the venue, and coaches may lose their accreditation for the entire event.

Please review these updates with your teams and ensure compliance during the competition. For full details, refer to the WA Rulebook 5, Chapter 34 and Run Archery European Cup Rules 2025.

F. Breaking ties

In case of a tie for the 10th place in the semi-finals, the athlete with the better qualification result will advance. If the tie persists, both athletes will qualify for the final.

In case of a tie in points, ranking will be determined as follows:

- 1. The athlete with more total hits in the Sprint and 4K races.
- 2. If still tied, the athlete with fewer arrows in Sprint Qualification.
- 3. If still tied, the athlete with the lower combined total time from Sprint Qualification and 4K

Main change is about the allocation of points. To make it more fair for each age category:

- For the U21W, U21M, 50W and 50M Categories, the top 10 WAE athletes will get points
- For the W and M categories, the top 20 WAE athletes will get points.

5.4 Accreditation card:

• Registered athletes and team officials will be issued an accreditation and lanyard. Please

ensure all details are correctly entered

Accreditation will be done by the LOC using WA database

6 Logistical aspects (OC)

Water:

There will be a refillable station at the venue.

Non-Smoking

This is a non-smoking event. Smoking is forbidden inside public buildings and all competition and training areas. This also includes electronic cigarettes, refer to book 3, Art.12.8.

The environment

Team managers, please instruct your team members to use the litter bins located on the competition, practice ranges and common areas at all times.
