**Rounds**

Long National	80 yards	60 yards	(Seniors)
National	60 yards	50 yards	(Seniors and all Under 18's)
National 50	50 yards	40 yards	(All Under 16's)
National 40	40 yards	30 yards	(All Under 14's)
National 30	30 yards	20 yards	(All Under 12's)
National 20	20 yards	10 yards	(All Under 10's)

**Six sighter arrows will be shot followed by four dozen arrows at longest distance and two dozen arrows at shorter distance.**

**Arrows will be shot in ends of six in 4 minutes.**

**There will be a max of 4 Archers to a Target**

**All Targets are Layered Foam**

**Five zone scoring: 9, 7, 5, 3, 1**

Note: At the end of the National round there will be the option to continue shooting an extra 24 arrows to gain a score for a 'Western'. This will allow the club time to calculate the "County Handicap" competition scores. There will be a small levy of a £1 for archers wishing to shoot the Western round extension; if you intend to shoot the Western round extension, please make sure you tick the relevant column on the entry form and include the additional cost when paying your entry fees.

## Notes

**Signing the entry form means you have read, understood, and accepted these notes, as appropriate.**

1: Would Club Secretaries / Records Officers / Entry Co-ordinators please ensure that archers' handicaps are stated in the relevant column on the entry form if they wish to enter the County Handicap Championships.

2: Receipt of fee does not guarantee a place if the target list is already full.

3: Juniors, ages must be specified on the entry form, and they must be accompanied by an adult with legal responsibility, coach or responsible adult.

4: Juniors wishing to shoot a higher round than that of their own (within the junior rounds) will still pay the junior fee but will compete against the age group they are shooting in for medals.

5: Juniors wishing to shoot in the senior rounds will pay the senior fee and will be competing against the seniors for medals.

6: Seniors wishing to shoot out of category must still pay the senior fee but will qualify for medals on the day. Please indicate on entry form if you are shooting out of category.

7: As agreed by the county, the following will apply. Archers meeting the criteria below must shoot the Long National:

Lady recurve archer with a handicap of 57	= 438	National 60 equivalence.
Gent recurve archer with a handicap of 49	= 506	National 60 equivalence.
Lady compound archer with a handicap of 47	= 520	National 60 equivalence.
Gent compound archer with a handicap of 41	= 558	National 60 equivalence.
Senior barebow archers – no handicap criteria	Round/distance shot at first competition remains constant	
Senior longbow archers – no handicap criteria	Round/distance shot at first competition remains constant	

8: Disabled archers should notify the organiser of the nature of their disability and any special requirements, e.g.: use of wheelchair or stool for shooting and/or the need to remain on the shooting line. If you are visually impaired, do you need a spotter? The organisers will do their best to accommodate you and meet your requirements.

9: **Parents & Guardians:** Please be aware, unless notified on the entry form, you are permitting photographs to be taken of you and the archer(s) named on the form by our authorised photographers. Please register with the organiser if you wish to take photos.

10: The following information may be collected and shared with tournament organisers, scoring systems and Archery GB (for example, Target Lists & Results may be published on the website and emailed direct to clubs/individuals containing the archers name, club and where appropriate, county and region and for juniors their age category maybe published  
**No information will be shared to or with any third party other than those stated above.**

11: All entrants must be members of Archery GB or a W.A. associated organisation. Membership cards may be asked for at registration.

12: All arrows must be found before leaving the field. Full carbon arrows are permitted; however, we respectfully request that they are fitted with metal pin nocks.

13: We will accept no liability for any loss or damage to any property / equipment during the tournament for any reason.

14: Dress Code: This will be in accordance with the Archery GB Dress Regulations (rule 307).

15: No smoking, vaping or any form of a naked flame is permitted anywhere on the site.

16: Audco Archers shooting ground is located within a working smallholding, please keep to the shooting field, toilet area and carpark. Feeding/petting of the Livestock is prohibited.

17: Guide/Assistance Dogs are welcome on the field but are prohibited from going anywhere near the livestock and must be kept on a lead at all times. If you bring a guide/assistance dog, please provide proof if asked.

18: Tea/Coffee/Squash will be available throughout the day; the 'famous' buffet will be provided after the tournament.

19: Raffle tickets will be available to purchase throughout the day; the draw will take place at the end of the tournament.

20: Car parking is limited, so where possible, car sharing would be appreciated, disabled spaces are available.

21: Target Lists and Results will be posted on the Audco Archers website and Ianseo, request for SAE if a hard copy is required.
