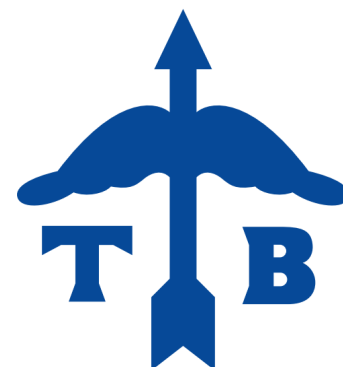

Classes, Divisions & Schedule

Divisions

At Trelleborg Open these 5 types of bows are allowed:*

- Recurve
- Compound
- Barebow
- Longbow
 - Both aluminum and wood arrows are allowed.
 - Laminated longbows are allowed.
- Traditional

**If a division has fewer than 8 total archers, we may combine the division with another division. For example, Longbow and Traditional.*

Classes

The following classes are as defined:*

- Men
- Women

**If a class has fewer than 8 archers, they will be combined to one mixed class.*

Schedule

Two different starting times for the qualification, 2x30 arrows on saturday and 1x30 arrows on sunday*

Saturday: 60 arrows qualification

- Start 1: 9:00
- Start 2: 13:00

Sunday: 30 arrows qualification

- Start 1: 8:30
- Start 2: 10:45

Sunday: Finals

**If you choose start 1 upon registration, you shoot in start 1 on both saturday and sunday.*

Arrows

The maximum diameter allowed for all arrowshafts are 10,7mm.

Clothing

Archers are not required to shoot in their clubs/ national team shirts or clothing.

Archers are thereby allowed to shoot in sponsorshirts.

Archers are given name tags upon registration at the venue, these have to be placed on either the archers quiver or similar. These name tags also contain information such as the archers club, nationality and shooting class.

Order of shooting, timing and target faces

Shooting order

Maximum of 4 shooters per target, AB-CD. The order of shooting will be alternating between the rounds (AB-CD, CD-AB, AB-CD ...), the current shooting order will be displayed on the timing system.

Timing

During the entire competition you have 40 seconds per arrow to shoot (120 seconds in qualification, and 40 seconds in case of a shoot-off). The time remaining will be displayed on the timing system.

Target faces

Your first target face of the day will be hung on the target before the competition starts, after that the archers can choose to change their own target at their own discretion.

- Recurve and Compound shoot on a vertical 40cm 3-spot target.
- Barebow shoots on a 10-ring 40cm target.
- Longbow and Traditional shoots on a 10-ring 60cm target.

Target Assignment

The target assignment for Saturday's qualification round will be posted on ianseos at the start of the competition week.

The target assignment for Sunday's qualification round will be according to the ranking after Saturday's qualification.

Scoring

Scoring in Qualification

- **Compound:** (Yellow) X - 10 - 9, (Red) 8 - 7, (Blue) 6
- **Recurve:** (Yellow) X - X - 10, (Red) 8 - 7, (Blue) 6
- **Barebow:** (Yellow) X - X - 10, (Red) 8 - 7, (Blue) 6...
- **Longbow:** (Yellow) X - X - 10, (Red) 8 - 7, (Blue) 6...
- **Traditional:** (Yellow) X - X - 10, (Red) 8 - 7, (Blue) 6...

X = 10 points

Scoring in Finals after two rounds

- **Compound:** (Yellow) 10 - 9, (Red) 8 - 7, (Blue) 6
- **Recurve:** (Yellow) 10 - 9, (Red) 8 - 7, (Blue) 6
- **Barebow:** (Yellow) 10 - 9, (Red) 8 - 7, (Blue) 6...
- **Longbow:** (Yellow) 10 - 9, (Red) 8 - 7, (Blue) 6...
- **Traditional:** (Yellow) 10 - 9, (Red) 8 - 7, (Blue) 6...

(The scoring in finals after two rounds, will be the same as in a "normal" WA 18m round)

Shoot-off

Shoot-offs to determine which archers make the cut to the finals will be shot after the final qualification rounds on Sunday.

You have 40 seconds to shoot one arrow, closest to the center wins. If there's a shoot-off for Recurve and Compound archers, the 2nd spot (middle) is to be shot at.

Finals

Finals will take place on Sunday afternoon. All archers who shoot a score of 900 (maximum score) and/or top 8 will shoot finals.*

Once the final starts, the score required to proceed to the next round is a score of 30 points. The first two rounds will be shot with a "big ten", same scoring as in qualification. For example, the entire yellow counts as ten points for recurve archers. All archers who shoot 30 points move on to the next round.

In the event that no archer shoots a score of 30 points, the final ranking will be according to the points shot that round. If the top 3 archers are tied, a shoot-off will take place to determine final ranking.

After two (2) rounds the scoring areas get smaller, to the same standard as WA. After a total of eight (8) scoring rounds all arrows must be inside-out 10's, which means that no arrows cannot touch the line between the scoring zone 9/10. If an arrow touches the line, it will count as a nine.

The shooting will continue until the top 3 archers have been seeded.

**A class must have at least 4 archers to be able to shoot finals.*

Scoring devices

All scoring throughout the competition will be made on one paper protocol and one mobile phone. One archer per target **must** connect via lanseo Scorekeeper NG to enter scores. In case of a mismatch between the paper protocol and the device, the paper protocol counts. If the protocol has a lower score than the device, the final score will be according to the protocol.

Double check all values on the protocol before signing it and turning it in!!

We strongly encourage all archers to download the app **lanseo Scorekeeper NG** on your phone prior to the competition to minimize potential delays. Wi-Fi is available at the competition venue.

Consequences of rule breaks

Shooting more than 3 arrows

If an archer shoots more than 3 arrows, the 3 lowest scores of the arrows will be scored.

Shooting at the wrong target

If an archer shoots at the wrong target, it will be marked as a miss.

Shooting after the time has run out

If an archer shoots after the time has run out, the highest score will be marked as a miss.

Scoring of arrows

If an arrow bounces back from the target, the lowest unmarked arrow hole on the target face will count as the score.

If an arrow is shot through the target, the lowest unmarked arrow hole on the target face will count as the score.

Judges

Judges will be present at the competition to guide the archers and make sure no rules are being broken.
