



Tockington Archers BBQ Tournament, Sunday 5th July 2026



General Information Sheet

Although information will be given on the day during Assembly, we know that some archers are anxious about attending tournaments and so this information sheet should provide plenty of information for you to feel relaxed about coming to our shoot.

Starting with the thing you want to know about most of course...!

Refreshments

Hot and cold drinks will be available all day at a cost of 50p - £1. We will accept cash or card payments through a SumUp machine.

Please bring your own mug if possible to save on waste - you will also get a discount if you do! 😊

Once the shooting is over, we'll head up to the pavilion area for the BBQ food. There will be a hotdog and burger each (and veggie versions for those who need them). If you prefer 2 hotdogs or burgers, please find a buddy to play swapsies with! There will be sauces, cheese, and onions to add yourself. All the meat will be gluten free. There will be gluten free bread for those who need it.

We do have a couple of people with food allergies or intolerances, so **please take care** not to muddle up tongs / spoons for serving.

We will also have plenty of cakes, including gluten free! One piece of cake is included in the BBQ at the end. If you wish to purchase extra cake earlier in the day or after the BBQ, you may do so!

Please bring a seat or blanket for your own comfort for the BBQ. There are limited benches on the school field.

Parking

Please park sensibly across the side of the field where indicated. Please keep the entranceway clear at all times. Some spaces for disabled archers or those with mobility difficulties will be reserved near the top of the field.

If we run out of space on the edge of the field, or if it is really wet on the day preventing easy movement across the grass, alternative car parking is available at the school car park 50 yards down the road. *See the Google map at the end of this document.*

Registration

Registration will be at a table near the pavilion 9 - 9.45am and you will need to show your AGB membership card (or electronic version). We will also chase up any entry fees that may be outstanding.

Photographs

We will have nominated club members taking photos on the day and we will send out a link to photos following the tournament. You may take photos without people in them, but please if you wish to take photos of family/friends which may include other archers in the photos, you need to sign the photography list which will be on the registration table. This is due to safeguarding guidance so we have a record of who may be taking photos.

If you have a query about anyone taking photographs during the day, please speak to the TO.

Please be aware that some archers do not consent to their photos being taken.

Clothing & Equipment

As it is a record status shoot, and we have some new archers at this tournament, we ask you please to familiarise yourself with the rules of shooting, which can be found on the sport80 members portal. This gives clear guidance on clothing and equipment for each bow style which is acceptable. The dress code rule 307 is at the end of this document as a reminder for you.

Please get in touch with the TO in advance if you have any queries about clothing and equipment, as we'd hate for anyone to come along who then finds they cannot be permitted to shoot for any reason.

Accessibility

The ground we use is a school field, and the parking area is also on the field, which is sometimes more accessible than others, and can be especially tricky if the weather is bad, becoming boggy and muddy. We will reserve some spaces for archers who need better accessibility, at the top of the field. There is a pavilion at the top of the field, which has ladies and gents toilets and limited kitchen facilities. We will use this during the day to serve refreshments, probably on the side veranda depending on the weather.

The gents toilets includes a cubicle with sink and then through a second door, a series of urinals with sinks.

The ladies toilet is one cubicle with sink, and is also a unisex accessible toilet if any disabled members may need it, with wider doorway/turning space, and handrails.

The pavilion is accessed via a small step, as seen in the photograph here:

Apologies, there is no ramp or step-free access to the pavilion.

As well as archers whose first language is not English, we currently have a deaf archer, blind archer, and seated archer at the tournament.

There will be extra sighters to comply with the rules for visually impaired archers – these will only apply for one archer. The judges will explain this on the day.

We hope we are an inclusive and welcoming club, and will do our best to meet your accessibility needs, please approach the TO on the day if you feel we could do better.



Limited space behind the waiting line

There is very limited space behind the “tent line”, sorry – especially at the furthest distances. You may set up tents just off the end of the shooting range for targets 1-3 if needed for shelter, but you may need to keep kit in cars once set up. Please bring an umbrella if the weather doesn't play fair. The shorter distances benefit from tree cover behind the waiting line.

Smoking / vaping

Please refrain from smoking or using vapes/e-cigarettes behind the waiting line. Please move to the car park entrance or to the other end of the shooting line (the other side of our rope), where there is a public footpath area, if you need to smoke / vape during the event. Please ensure all cigarette butts are extinguished and put into a bin, not left on the school property.

During shooting

All arrows must be accounted for, as it is a school field. Please count your arrows before you start, whilst shooting, and count again at the end! Please indicate to a judge if you have lost an arrow so we can ensure the field crew find it.

We should have electronic timers on the day to control and signify shooting details. The judges will explain these on the day. If for any reason they fail, whistles and flags may be used - again the judges will explain that as needed.

There will be a comfort break at the distance change.

We have a small but amazing field crew, so any assistance you can give moving targets at distance change would be much appreciated, but please take care not to hurt yourself and if you're not sure, just let the field crew handle it.

After shooting

Once the tournament has finished and you've completed and signed score sheets and inputted everything to your PDA, please take them as quickly as possible to the TO so we can start compiling results. Then pack up all your things and move up towards the pavilion where we will hold the BBQ, raffle, and award presentation. (Outside if dry or damp, inside like sardines if very wet!)

Raffle

There will be a fantastic raffle available at the end of the day with tickets sold throughout the day for £1 for 5 tickets. Payments will be gratefully received by cash or card on the SumUp machine. The raffle will be drawn at some point once we're all sat eating/drinking near the pavilion.

Records

We'll have forms printed off for UK record claims, 6/3 gold end badges, so please come and see the TO at the end if you need to claim.

i@nseo system

Please bear with the technology – it should make the day and scoring easier!

On the day your target will be issued with a PDA (personal digital assistant) to input scores. These will be updated live all day at: [ianseo 26521 - BBQ Shoot 2026](#)

If no one on your target has used the PDAs before, the TO can show you how they work.

If there are any discrepancies between the paper and the PDA, the paper score sheet will be accepted as the correct version, so please check frequently that the scores are aligned! Remember, only a judge may change an arrow value once written down, and only before the arrows are removed.

We will have a fancy Excel sheet run the figures once we're all done to calculate highest scores for bow styles and genders, merged across the distances. This will not show on i@nseo, but results will be sent out and uploaded to the tournament page within 48 hours of the tournament end.

Awards

There will be 'medal' badges awarded for 1st - 3rd at all distances/bow styles/genders.

We have some lovely wooden trophies which will only be awarded to the highest in each bow style category (men/women/50+ and juniors), based on the clever Excel sheet workings out! There will also be a Highest Novice trophy for male and female, calculated using the fancy spreadsheet. Trophies should be returned each year to be presented the following year.

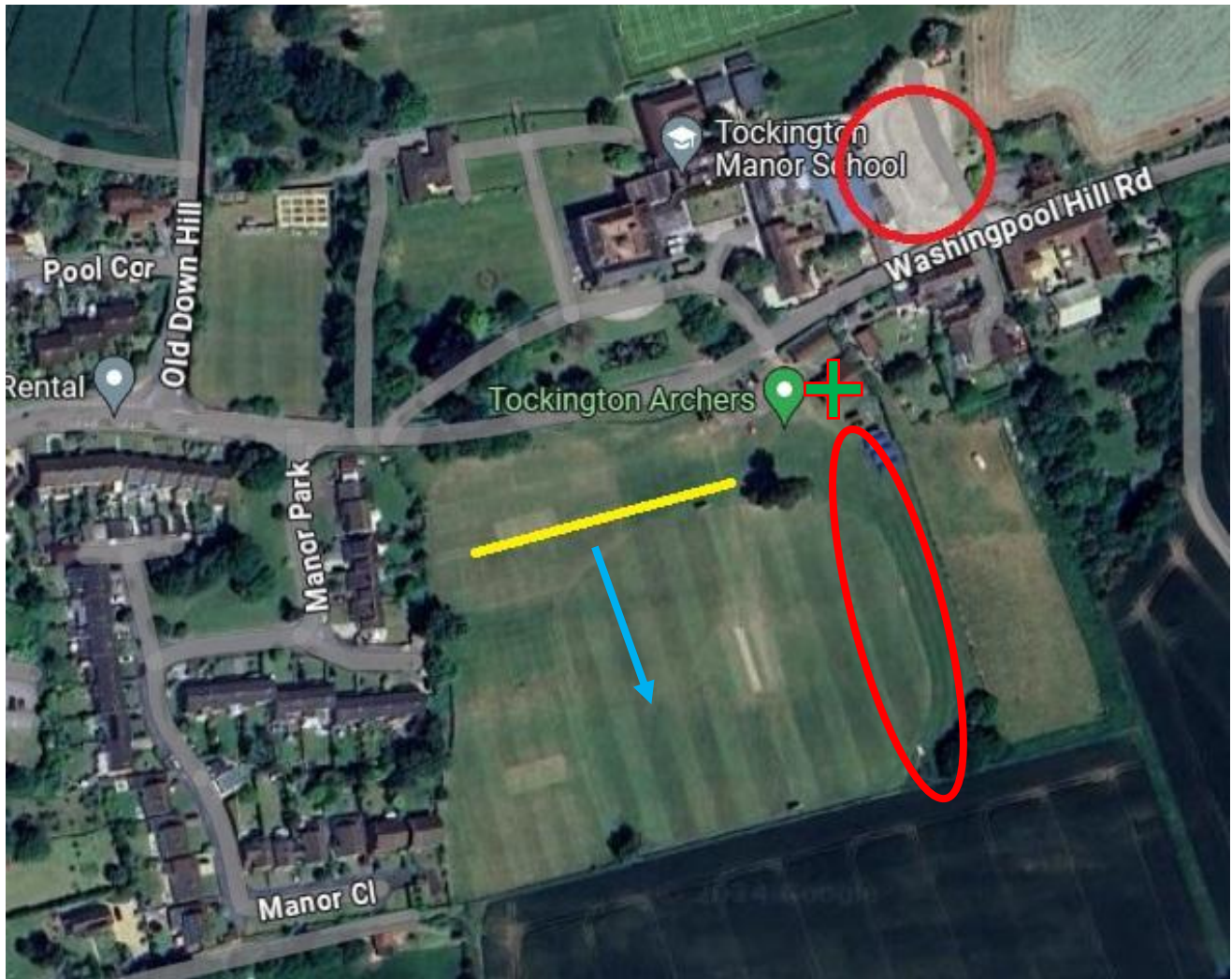
Tockington Manor Lower Field:

 = parking (across edge of field or in school car park 50 yards past the field entrance, take care on road from the car park as no footpath on one side)

 = shooting line

 = direction of shooting

 = toilets, refreshments & first aid



The current Rules of Shooting section 307 is below. Please double check for any changes on the AGB members portal prior to the tournament:

307. Dress Regulations

- (a) The recognised dress of Archery GB is plain dark green and/or white.
- (b) Footwear that fully encloses the toes and front of the foot must be worn at all times when shooting.
- (c) Members of Archery GB shooting and officiating at tournaments granted UK or World Record Status by Archery GB are required to wear clothing that is appropriate, clean, in good condition (ie not frayed or worn, either deliberately or by use) and conventional in style and appearance. In particular:
 - (i) **Tops or shirts must cover the front and back of the body (including the midriff when at full draw), they must not be strapless and must include sleeves of any length with the exception of clothing for Run Archery.**
 - (ii) Any colour garments may be worn with the exception of blue denim and camouflage pattern.
 - (iii) **Badges, Logos and Wording.**
 - a. Clothing manufacturers' trademarks are allowed. The wearer's name is allowed.
 - b. Individuals, and members of clubs and other archery organisations that are commercially sponsored may wear sponsors' logos and names during the sponsorship period only.
 - c. Other wording or badges on clothing must represent archery organisations.
 - (iv) Members of Archery GB who are officiating as the Chair of Judges, Judge or Director of Shooting at a UK or World Record Status tournament shall wear Archery GB recognised Judges official dress.
 - (v) A member of Archery GB who has represented Great Britain (GBR) as an archer at an international tournament may wear their international shooting uniform for the remainder of that season and the following one.
