Registration	Registration will open at 9.15am Membership cards will be required. If you are not in possession of a 2024/2025 card, please bring proof that you have paid your membership to your club.

Entry	Entries will be taken via the Google Form. All entries must be submitted through the form. NISCAC and the Tournament Organiser have the right to refuse anyone entry to the competition.	
Event Timings	Morning Assembly 9.45am, followed by 1 end of sighters (6 arrows) at the longest distance. The competition will commence immediately after sighters.	
Event Format	<p>The competition will consist of a UK Record Status 1440 round</p> <p>50 Open – 122cm face at 70m, 60m, followed by 80cm face at 50m then 30 m 50 W – 122cm face at 60m, 50m, followed by 80cm face at 40m then 30 m Open – 122cm face at 90m, 70m, followed by 80cm face at 50m then 30 m W – 122cm face at 70m, 60m, followed by 80cm face at 50m then 30 m U15 Open – 122cm face at 50m, 40m, followed by 80cm face at 30m then 20 m U15 W – 122cm face at 50m, 40m, followed by 80cm face at 30m then 20 m U18 Open – 122cm face at 70m, 60m, followed by 80cm face at 50m then 30 m U18 W – 122cm face at 60m, 50m, followed by 80cm face at 40m then 30 m U21 Open – 122cm face at 90m, 70m, followed by 80cm face at 50m then 30 m U21 W – 122cm face at 70m, 60m, followed by 80cm face at 50m then 30 m</p> <p>All distances will be 6 ends of 6 arrows.</p> <p>The competition will be shot in accordance with Archery GB Rules of Shooting. An archer may enter a round in a higher age group than their own, but not a lower age group. Should an archer wish to shoot 'down' an age group they will not be eligible for medals.</p> <p>There will be a max of four archers per target. Most bosses will be straw on tripod frames with 2 foam bosses predominantly for compounds.</p>	

Timing system	<p>Shooting will be controlled by electronic means either using a Danage system with external speakers or Chronotir using internal speakers.</p> <p>In the event of a failure of the electronic timing system, control will be taken over by the Judges using stop watches, whistles and flags.</p>
Awards	<p>Medals will be awarded on the following basis in all disciplines for each competition:</p> <p>1 - 2 entries – 1st 3 - 4 entries - 2nd 5 or more entries – 3rd</p>
GDPR	<p>“When you enter competitions the following information may be collected and shared with tournament organisers, scoring systems and other competitors for example target lists and results may be published: First Name, Surname, Gender, Bow style, Date of Birth / Age category, Email, Address, Phone number, Club (and ID), County (and ID), Region (and ID), Round (unless defined by age), Disabled (Y/N), Disability info.</p>
Junior archers	<p>All Junior archers (i.e. archers under the age of 18) must be accompanied by a parent/guardian for the duration of the event.</p>
Code of conduct	<p>Archery GB strive to have a welcoming and friendly atmosphere at all levels of competition, and for everyone attending to leave having enjoyed their day's competition.</p> <p>Archery GB welcome encouragement and cheering in support of competing athletes, in a good sporting manner.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are asking all individuals to please think how you are behaving at events when supporting people. • Ask yourself what an acceptable way is to behave in a sporting environment. • Please treat others as you would like to be treated yourself. • When supporting people in matches please do so in good taste. • Please demonstrate good sportsmanship when supporting all athletes. <p>Examples of poor sportsmanship; the purposeful wrong calling of arrows or shouting loudly when an opponent is at full draw.</p> <p>If you feel anyone is behaving in an inappropriate manner at any competition you are attending, inform either the Chair of Judges or the Tournament Organiser, (both should make themselves known at assembly) The CoJ and TO have the right to ask any person to leave the field of play or the competition.</p>
Target List & Results	<p>Will be published in NICSAC website, Facebook page & lanseo.net.</p>
Dress	<p>Please refer to the Archery GB Rules of Shooting for the dress regulations 307 Archers should comply with dress regulations until after the presentations.</p> <p>Please wear appropriate clothing for shooting outdoors.</p>
Drug Testing	<p>Archers competing at record status tournaments may be liable for drugs testing. Competitors who are approached to give samples must comply. Non-compliance will be treated as a positive result. Parents / Guardians must sign the relevant box on the entry forms giving consent for junior archers (Under 18's) to be drug tested if approached.</p>
